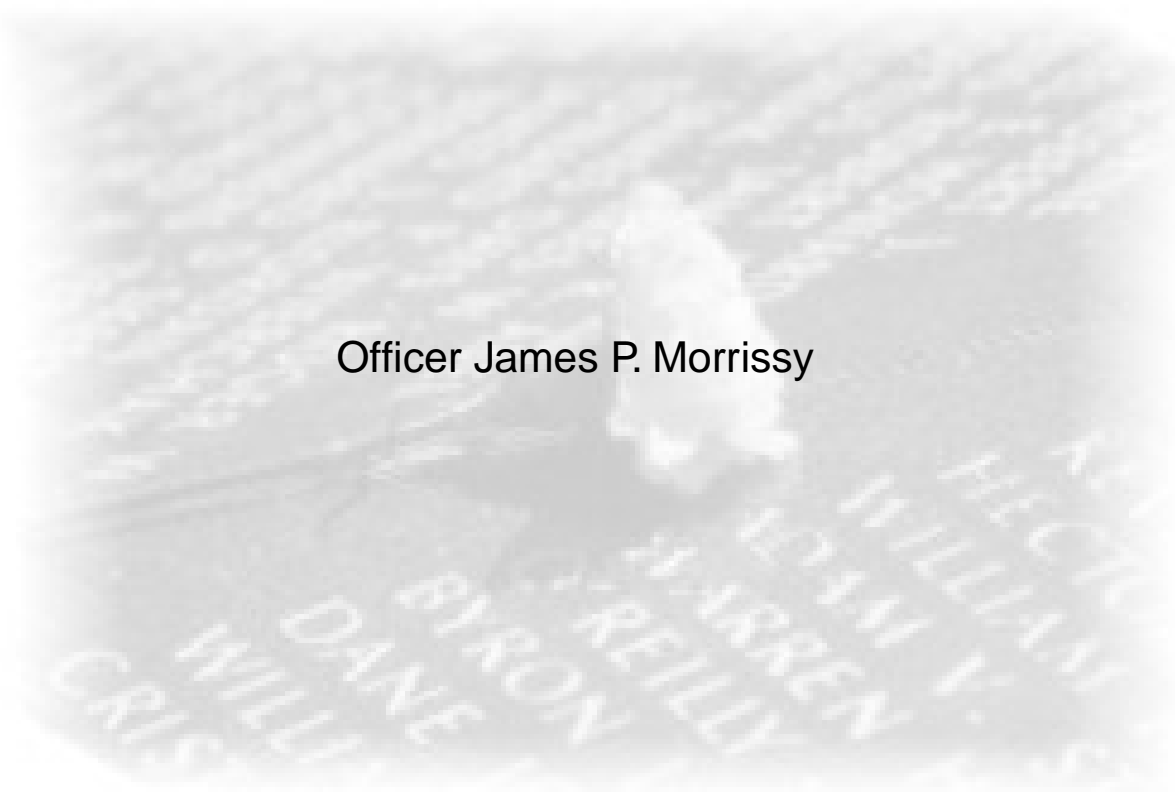

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED

During 2014, one Illinois law enforcement officer lost his life in the performance of his duties while upholding the laws of the state of Illinois. A brief narrative of the circumstances surrounding the death is presented below.

March 17, 2014— OAK FOREST POLICE DEPARTMENT

Officer James P. Morrissy was killed in an automobile crash while on duty. When responding to back up another officer at a domestic dispute call, Officer Morrissy's vehicle was struck by another vehicle in an intersection. He succumbed to his injuries a short time later. Officer Morrissy had served with the Oak Forest Police Department for 30 years.
