43.04 ASSAULT. No person shall commit an assault in the Village. A person commits an assault when, without lawful authority, he/she engages in conduct which places another in reasonable apprehension of receiving battery. Any offense arising under this Section 43.04, may be settled and compromised by the offender by payment to the Village the sum of money stated for a Class C violation in Chapter 1.07-E.

43.05 FIREARMS. No person shall discharge any firearms or do any hunting in the Village except for the following:

- A. This section shall not apply to peace officers in the line of duty or any person acting in self-defense or defense of another person.
- B. This section shall not apply to a landowner or persons on the land with permission of the landowner, from target skeet shooting and/or hunting on agricultural classified land, from sunrise to sunset using semi-automatic shot guns, and further provided that such shooting shall be at least 300 feet from the nearest non-owned residence or business structure.
- C. This Section shall not apply to the discharge of starter pistols at sporting events, nail guns and other devices used by contractors in the performance of a construction contract or military and funeral ceremonies or animal training devices being used by animal trainers, thunder cannons and devices used to disperse animals and birds, and weapons that fire only non-projectile charges and pellets.
- D. Any offense arising under this Section 43.05, may be settled and compromised by the offender by payment to the Village the sum of money stated for a Class C violation in Chapter 1.07-E.

43.06 WEAPONS.

- A. A person who is not a Village officer, shall not carry about his person any concealed pistol, or firearms, switchblade, or knife with a blade three inches or longer, razor, slingshot, metal knuckles or any other weapon or thing of deadly character.
- B. No person shall sell, give or transfer any such weapon to any minor person under the age of 21.
- C. Any offense arising under this Section 43.06, may be settled and compromised by the offender by payment to the Village the sum of money stated for a Class D violation in Chapter 1.07-E.
- D. A minor under the age of 21 shall not be in possession of or carry about his person on school grounds any concealed pistol, switchblade, knife of any size blade, razor, slingshot, metal knuckles or any other weapon or thing of deadly character.
